Max Blumenthal

is a radical anti-Israel, anti-peace activist has been exposed for:

- Writing lies about Israel

Blumenthal misquoted Karen Greenberg, the director of the Fordham School of Law's Center on National Security. In an article he quotes Greenberg as accusing Israel of training American interrogators on torture. Greenberg has explicitly stated that she said no such thing.

Blumenthal falsely claimed on his blog that Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu called the 9-11 attacks "very good." This is nothing short of blood-libel, a malicious lie intended to generate hatred for Israel and the Jewish people.

Blumenthal's anti-Semitic book, "Goliath: Life and Loathing in Greater Israel," has received harsh criticism even from outspoken critics of Israel. Eric Alterman of the *The Nation* has dubbed Blumenthal's book the "I Hate Israel' Handbook." Alterman remarked that he "did not expect it to be remotely as awful as it is...It is no exaggeration to say that this book could have been published by the Hamas Book-of-the-Month Club (if it existed)."
